

Message From Chairman:

Lynn Township has been very busy this past year. Here are a few major developments.

The Active Adult Retirement Community (AARC) ordinance that was passed late in 2005 was found to have several problems and was repealed. As of the publication date of this newsletter, the decision on the AARC plan is under appeal.

Also in development news, two farms in the Rural Center- New Tripoli are slated to be preserved. Lynn Township continues to be the leader in rural preservation in Lehigh County. Our Rural Center will also be called Village Center from now on.


At the November meeting the supervisors created an Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC). The EAC will be composed of residents and will advise the Supervisors about environmental problems and conservation of natural resources in the Township. Members of the committee will be appointed in January, 2007. Residents who are interested in serving should send a letter of interest to the Board of Supervisors.

The Road crew is busy preparing for the winter snow. We have 4 plows and 250 tons of salt standing by for the 71 miles of township roads. This summer 17 miles of road were upgraded. As you may have noticed, the old pool and bath house at Ontelaunee Park HAVE BEEN removed. This will improve the LOOK of the Park entrance.

In personnel matters, Tracy Miklus has been hired as the township Secretary/Asst. Treasurer. This position is now at the township zoning office. Kevin Deppe has hit the ground running as the Township's new Zoning Officer.

As always, the Board of Supervisors welcomes your comments and suggestions. We look forward to a productive and happy new year.

ONTELAUNEE PARK

Exciting activities such as the Historical Society Pioneer Day, Family Reunions and picnics, Lynnport Fire Company Fireworks, weddings and receptions, free concert, and community yard sale have been part of the 2006 activities.

Projects for 2006 included completion of the gateway garden planting along Rte. 143 by the Girl Scouts. Boy Scout Justin Selig completed the butterfly garden for his eagle project with Blue Mountain Nursery donating the plants. Eric Lundberg, Blue Mountain Nursery donated and planted beautiful plants throughout Ontelaunee Park. New Tripoli Bank built a 77'x50' picnic pavilion and Nestles of North America completed the stone spring house. The NYAA soccer teams had stone picking parties on the all purpose field and grass was planted. The first soccer game was played on 9/09/06. The Girl Scouts and Steph Misera and friends are working on beautifying the fountain area. Dr. Dan Crane and Allentown West Rotary Members worked on trails in the park.

LYNN TOWNSHIP SEWER AUTHORITY

The Wastewater Treatment Plant is permitted at 0.080 MGD (Million Gallons Per Day). The following chart is the seven-month rainfall and average flow per month at the wastewater treatment plant.

The average rainfall for the seven-month period is 5.15 inches of rain and the average flow for seven months is 0.070 MGD.

The Authority workers are busy this Fall cleaning around manholes (cutting sticker bushes and weeds) and checking for leaks in the system. Weather permitting, leaks will be repaired to reduce infiltration.

The following items should be disposed of properly in your trash: paper products such as paper towels, sanitary items, plastic products and dental floss which entangles other waste products. Dispose of grease and cooking oil in closed containers and place in the trash. Please fix leaking faucets and toilets. Basement sump pumps may not be discharged into the sewer system.

Whassup . . . in Lynn Township?

Because one might think nothing other than controversial zoning issues happen in Lynn Township, some of the Board's other activities for the past year are highlighted below.

Road Crew added members: Ever since former supervisor Jan Schaeffer was not reappointed to the road crew, our crew had only three full-time members: Charlie Lenhart, Bruce Raber and Joe Wisser. Although, the three-person crew served us well, roadwork was accumulating. So in May, the Board welcomed Joe Howard as an additional full time member to the road crew. In July, the Board also welcomed Andy Whaling as a new part time crewmember. In addition, our Road Master, Bruce Raber, reports monthly on road maintenance and department activities. His reports are given at every workshop meeting.

Ken Bleiler retired, New Zoning Officer hired: Faced with Ken Bleiler's retirement after 35 years of service, the Board welcomed Kevin Deppe as the Township's Zoning Officer & Administrator. In addition to his zoning duties, Kevin oversees the daily activities in the Township Office.

Interim Treasurer remains, for the time being: Given some transitional difficulties not of his own making, our "Interim Treasurer", Rob Sadler, graciously remained on staff while the Board implemented tighter controls, reporting and record-keeping procedures. Recently, the Board also hired Tracy Miklus as an Assistant Treasurer and Board Secretary. The Board hopes that Tracy will succeed Rob after Rob returns to his expected retirement.

Yes, Virginia, horses are farm animals: A personal victory of a sort, we, i.e. the Board, finally amended its zoning ordinance to allow for the raising, care, breeding, boarding and training of horses in an agriculture zone. No special permit is required for regular horse operations excluding riding academies in an agriculture zone.

Springhouse Road Speed limits set: Responding to a resident's suggestion after a horrible accident, the Board commissioned Penn DOT for a speed limit study on two local roads. Speed limits have been set as follows: 40mph on Slateville Road from Route 143 to Steinsville Road; 35mph on Springhouse Road from Gun Club Road to Route 309.

The Regional Plan, it is not over till the fat lady sings: Thought all was done for the regional plan? Think again. It is not just writing the plan, but also to implement it! In that regard, the Board finally amended its zoning ordinance, map and SALDO to conform to the Regional Plan. Other townships must also follow before year's end.

The disappearing pool house: A mounting potential danger, the deteriorating bath house and adjacent swimming pool at Ontelaunee Park is slated for demolition. Although much planning has been undertaken to ensure the safety of the demolition, workers and the public at large, please refrain from entering the former pool and bathhouse area until further notice from the Township.

The Board considers Certified Public Accounts: In view of the financial discrepancies found over the past year, the Board is considering the services of a CPA firm to sample our fiscal 2005 accounts and audit the books going forward. Be sure to comment on these proposals as they are advertised and presented in upcoming meetings.

Environmental Advisory Committee formed: Joining the growing list of townships in Lehigh County, the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors recently adopted an ordinance for the formation of an Environmental Advisory Committee, which shall identify environmental resources and issues facing Lynn Township, propose appropriate safeguards, and make recommendations as to the use of open areas.

Fact or fiction: Madison Park North playground: Perhaps overshadowed by another important park project, there is a 1 acre tract, previously known as "Open Space 3", off Jefferson Street, New Tripoli. The area was thought to have been reserved for a small playground or "tot lot". Given that a play area is desperately needed for the smallest children in New Tripoli, the Board seeks to iron out details between the developer, the water authority and any local homeowner's association so that a playground can be built. Please offer your insight and stay tuned for more details.


It is an un-wired planet: Because a new year brings many new terms, the Board invites residents of Lynn Township to apply for the various vacancies as they might arise on the following boards: Environmental Advisory Commission, Planning Commission, Zoning Hearing Board, Sewer Authority and the Recreation Commission. Applicants must be residents of Lynn Township and at least 18 years old.

Burning Ordinance No. 86-3

Recently I've received many complaints from residents in the village of New Tripoli about outdoor burning and noxious smoke. Lynn Township Ordinance No. 86-3 precludes the burning of artificial or man-made materials, i.e. that which will emit noxious, harmful or toxic smoke. While naturally this precludes the burning of tires, upholstered furniture, rugs, and the like, it also precludes burning smaller man-made combustibles, such as plastic bottles, garbage bags, diapers, milk-jugs, Styrofoam and so forth. The Ordinance also precludes burning anything in a manner that will cause your neighbor annoyance or alarm. This means one can not burn where the smoke from such burning is likely to blow through your neighbor's yard, porch, window, outdoor pool, outbuilding, etc. Similarly, while, Lynn Township does not directly regulate the use and placement outdoor wood furnaces, the Ordinance does prohibit burning man-made materials in outdoor furnaces. Outdoor furnaces are not to be used as private garbage disposals. Likewise the dumping of ash that is contaminated with partially combusted plastic, burnt cans, burnt aluminum foil is also prohibited. So while unlawful burning and dumping could result in an enforcement action, its better to be kind to your neighbor and to your environment. My community and I, thank you.

LYNN TOWNSHIP FIRE COMPANY NEWS

CALL 9-1-1 FOR EMERGENCY HELP

Lynn Township has two Volunteer Fire Companies. The fire departments respond to any fire within their service areas. They also respond to car accidents and emergency medical calls. Most members are trained to be First Responders and will provide some medical help until the ambulance arrives. Some members are also trained in Rescue and participate in the Lehigh County Technical Rescue Team.

**Interview with Dave Wright
Fire Chief, Lynnport Fire Company**

I started as a junior firefighter at age 16 in a junior fire fighter program at the Woodlawn Fire Company. There were 7 or 8 of us who joined. We thought it was a big deal to be involved. The older guys found out that we could help roll hose, set up lights and stage tools for their use. We trained hard when we were young, and when we turned 18, we were ready to drive trucks and operate equipment. Two of the original juniors are still at Woodlawn as volunteers. Lynnport is lucky. We have 3 junior fire fighters and it is nice to have them involved.

I've been with Lynnport since 1999. I felt like I belonged there within 1 week. There is good camaraderie there. The reason I do this is to help people in the community.

The area is growing, and there's not much you can do to stop it. We are in the line of growth. Along with growth comes more traffic and more needs. We have to try to keep up and offer the best services we can.

Lynnport has both fire fighting and Quick Response Medical Service (QRS). There are 19 fire fighters and fire police. For medical needs, we respond to stroke, shock, falls, and car accidents. Nearly half of our calls are for QRS. We can offer first aid, oxygen and external defibrillation. Often we get to the scene before the ambulance arrives. We can stabilize the person. We also take the QRS truck out to the fire calls. It is a safety net for our personnel. We monitor blood pressure, heart rate and, if necessary, ask the fire fighters to rest until the ambulance arrives. Eight of us just finished a 48 hours of training in a rescue course.

These services are nice additions to the community!

At Lynnport, we are funded by fundraisers, donations, and the work of about 75 dedicated volunteers! We need at least \$75,000 a year just to cover expenses of the fire stations and the fundraisers.

I'd like to thank all the people who participate at the Lynnport Fire Company. It's a big responsibility and a challenge to commit the time, and I'm grateful.



DID YOU KNOW THAT:

- **No Lynn Township Fire Company person is paid. All are volunteers.**
- **No Lynn Township Fire Company person has a benefit paid life insurance or funeral expenses. Disability insurance is paid for by Lynn Township and supplemented by the Fire Companies.**
- **Fire truck loans run as long as some house mortgages (20 years).**
- **The cost to heat New Tripoli and Lynnville Fire Stations was almost \$9,000 in 2005.**
- **Fire Trucks are getting bigger and newer equipment may not fit into the existing buildings.**
- **It takes 80 hours of classroom training to have the essentials in basic fire fighting.**
- **To get grants, fire companies must prove that their firefighters have taken required courses.**
- **There are many federal and state regulations that must be met, which did not exist years ago.**
- **It costs about \$6,000 per person to buy gear for a firefighter.**
- **Insurance cost New Tripoli Fire Company \$15,256 last year.**
- **Fire Trucks cost about \$300,000 to \$500,000.**
- **Car insurers do not pay volunteer fire companies, should they help in a car accident. Ambulance service is paid by car or medical insurers.**
- **Lynn Township currently donates about \$7,400 to each fire company. The Township pays for most of the fire companies' disability insurances.**
- **If our volunteer fire companies stopped all fundraisers, fire and rescue service would cost Lynn more than \$120,000 a year. An additional property tax of at least 1.2 MIL would be needed to pay for the fire and rescue expenses. This DOES NOT include salaries for the volunteer fire and rescue staff!**



Funding received to repair the Leaser Lake Dam

On September 28th Gov. Rendell presented a check for 4.8 million dollars to Lehigh County Executive Don Cunningham. Combined with the \$500,000 which has been pledged by Lehigh County, there is now sufficient funding to repair the Leaser Lake Dam!!! **THANK YOU** to everyone who has supported the efforts to get this funding!!!

Engineering services to design the repairs necessary to fix the dam are currently being bid out through the State. It is anticipated that the lake will have to be totally drained in order to complete these repairs. The preliminary project schedule anticipates construction to begin in the Fall of 2008 and complete refilling of the Lake by the Fall of 2010.

So is the work by the Leaser Lake Heritage Foundation complete? Nope, we've just begun on this project! Getting the dam repaired is just the first phase of the Foundation's plans for Leaser Lake. We are currently working on a grant application for a Facilities Master Plan for the lake and surrounding public land. Potential improvements which we hope to see detailed in this plan include a loop trail around the lake, wildlife blinds, a handicapped accessible fishing deck, preservation of additional open space, and a variety of environmental education and recreation programs.

We are also going to be actively involved in the restoration of the Lake's ecosystem. In December we will be sponsoring the Leaser Lake Restoration Roundtable. We will bring together experts in Lake Ecology, Fisheries Management, Fish Habitat, Wetlands Restoration, and Wildlife Habitat. Using this roundtable discussion as a springboard, we hope to have a comprehensive Lake Restoration Plan in place BEFORE the Lake is refilled.

Now is the time to get involved in the Leaser Lake Heritage Foundation and help shape the future of this beautiful park. The Foundation meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 7pm in the Lynn Township Municipal Building. ??? Answers to Some Frequently Asked Permit Questions???

- Permits are not required for fences unless they are 6' or more in height. Permits are also required for retaining walls 4' or more in height. No retaining wall, shrubbery or fence, regardless of height, may obstruct the sight distance at any intersection or driveway. No fences or retaining walls are allowed on Township or State road right-of-way.
- Permits are required for all construction, re-construction or alteration made to any structure.
- Permits are required for "changes in use" such as converting a garage to a family room.
- Installation and/or paving a driveway requires a permit. The Zoning Office should be contacted prior to work being done to check for conformance with ordinance.
- Permits are required for any repair or change to a septic system.
- Permits are required for above ground and in ground swimming pools, as well as, hot tubs and spas. Specific setback requirements exist.
- Permits are required for any business run from your home. (Home Occupations)
- Permits are required for signs whether permanent or temporary.
- Permits are required for moving into, within, or out of the Township.
- Permits are required for the demolition/razing of any structures.

From the Zoning Office...

The Township frequently receives calls about property line disputes, tree trimming, and other problems that are based on neighbor disputes. The Zoning Officer cannot intercede with these complaints. Complaints between property owners must be handled civilly.

All complaints based on Zoning or Township ordinances must be in writing. The Township has a specific form in the office that can be filled out in the office, or if it is more convenient for you we can mail the form to you and you can return it by dropping it off or mailing it to us. The form when completely filled out provides the necessary background information for our follow-up. Once this written form has been received, inspections and proper action can be taken.



HAVE YOU MOVED IN, OUT or WITHIN LYNN TOWNSHIP???

MOVING PERMITS are required by Township ordinance for all persons moving **into**, **within**, or **out of** Lynn Township. This permit may be obtained free of charge at the Municipal Building in Lynnport or by calling 610-298-2645. By obtaining and filling out moving permits, the Township establishes a census record of its residents. The record is used by the Northwestern Lehigh School District to project student populations and growth of school facilities. It is also used by the Earned Income Tax Bureau in collecting the 1% earned income tax from employers. Census figures also help to determine amounts of Federal and State assistance available for the Township. These are some of the reasons why it is imperative to have as correct a census as possible. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Landlords are required to submit a list of their tenants to the Township Zoning Office every year prior to February 1st.

TO THE RESIDENTS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP

It appears that there are still some of you who have not properly displayed their street address on their premises. It is extremely important and required by the township that you identify your property in case of an emergency situation when the fire company or ambulance services must respond. If they can not find you, they might not be in time to help you out. Please mark your property accordingly. The township office has all the requirements for lot identification in case you need them.

Reflective numbers and/or letters not less than two (2) inches high are required. These can be purchased through your local fire company or any store which handles this type of material.



LET IT SNOW!

And speaking of snow removal, so that the snowplows do not plow your driveway shut, it is recommended that you clear your driveway at least 15' to the left or right depending on which side of the road you live. The trucks always drive in the direction of traffic, plowing to the right, so clear the snow on the side that they will pass first.

(See diagram to the right!)




PLEASE DO NOT PARK YOUR VEHICLE(S) ON THE STREET DURING A SNOW EVENT. This is especially true in cul-de-sacs, where the plow operator needs the entire area to maneuver. Residents are also reminded that the practice of shoveling, blowing or plowing of snow onto or along roads and cul-de-sacs is prohibited. Pennsylvania's Motor Vehicle Code provides a maximum fine of \$300.00 for this violation

Where are the Road Signs Going?

Recently the Road Master has noticed that our road signs are disappearing. Please be aware that these signs cost a lot of money, which in turn are costing our taxpayers. This is also a safety problem, due to the fact that our emergency personnel depend on these street signs to help them get to emergencies quickly.


