## Board of Supervisors Thursday, January 13th, 2011 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.-7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

<u>Call to Order</u>: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Vice Chairman Kermit E. DeLong, Member David C. Najarian, Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Solicitor Marc Fisher, NW Press Reporter Elsa Kerschner, and approximately 9 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Public Comment: None

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to accept the minutes from 12/27/10 (close-out) meeting and the 01/03/11 (re-org) meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to pay all the bills with the exception of the Horwith fuel bill. Kermit DeLong abstained from the vote because of the Devine Springs water bill. Motion carried. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to direct the treasurer to pay the bills. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company. Motion carried.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Roadmaster, reported for the month of <u>December</u>: (1) Tree trimmed Dresher & Levans Road. (2) Took scrap metal from transfer station; \$84.00. (3) Started boom mowing. (4) Started re-facing stop signs and replacing them. (5) Salted & cindered roads and plowed roads. (6) Plumbing repairs made to bathroom sink. (7) Loaded the old wheel roller on trailer and hauled it to scrap yard; \$1,362.00. (8) Made brake repairs to two trucks; 97 Ford & 91 Chevy; replaced hydraulic hose on 88 Mack; replaced two relays for plow on the 550 Ford. Anticipated work for <u>January</u>: (1) Continue boom mowing. (2) Tree trimming.

Alternate Zoning Officer: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich appointing Keystone Consulting Engineering as alternate zoning officer for Lynn Township. Motion carried unanimously.

Alternate Building Codes Official: The BOS decided that appointing an alternate BCO was not an issue at this time. Pension: Duane Peoples from Raymond James & Associates presented the BOS with status regarding the pension for Lynn Township. Mr. Peoples stated that the actuary report will be forth coming to the Township sometime in March and upon review of the report he will report back to the township at the March BOS meeting to review the re-allocation of the plans assets. The BOS will need to approve Mr. Peoples to enable him to be on the actuary side of the pension. Mr. Peoples also discussed with the BOS the township's Money Market and Capital Reserve accounts and further options to invest the monies as well as secure an FDIC insurance to fully cover all of the funds.

Managers Report: (1) Kevin Deppe brought to the BOS attention that during the recent snow fall, the plowing of the streets in the town houses was difficult for the road crew due to the fact that residents did not move their vehicles off the road way. David Najarian stated that because this has been an ongoing issue, the township could put in place that permits have to be required for parking or that signs could be erected stating no parking on the streets in the event of a snow fall of 3" or more. The townships current ordinance states that upon 3" of snow or more, vehicles are to be moved. The ordinance also states that vehicles can be towed. Solicitor Marc Fisher will review the current Ordinance that is in effect. The current complex of Penn's View I does not include an overflow parking area. This will also be an issue with 2 other developments that were also approved without an overflow parking area.

<u>Miscellaneous:</u> (1) During the re-org meeting, Brian Dietrich was appointed as the representative for the REC Commission. Brian Dietrich informed the BOS that the REC meeting conflicts with the Emergency Steering Committee to which he also attends at Heidelberg Township. Kermit DeLong has agreed to be the representative to the Emergency Steering Committee and David Najarian has agreed to be the alternate representative.

<u>Public Comment</u>: Resident, Richard Snyder stated that the BOS may want to check with the NTFC to see if the lot behind the fire company could be used as an over flow lot for residents of the town houses in the event of a snowfall and to allow the road crew to properly plow the roads.

Announcements: Lynn Township re organizational dinner, Saturday, January 15, 2011 @ 6pm; New Tripoli Fire Co. Adjournment: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:10 pm.
