Board of Supervisors Thursday, January 14th, 2010 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.-7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

Call to Order: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman David C. Najarian, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman David C. Najarian, Vice Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Member Kermit E. DeLong Jr., Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Solicitor Marc Fisher, NW Press Reporter Ken Petrini, and approximately 11 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Public Comment: None

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to accept the minutes from 12/29/08 (close-out) meeting and the 01/04/10 (re-org) meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to direct the treasurer to pay the bills. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company. Motion carried.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Roadmaster, reported for the month of December: (1) Boom mowing, half way around township. (2) Tree Trimming. (3) Took down old Transfer Station building and cleaned up. (4) Truck repairs, repaired snow chains for trucks and made repairs on two snow plows. (5) Plowed, salted & cindered roads. (6) Erected new road name signs and made repairs to existing signs. (7) Picked up 40 tires at top of Blue Mt. House Rd. Anticipated work for January: (1) Continue boom mowing. (2) Tree Trimming.

Managers Report: Kevin Deppe, Township Manager, reported for the month of December: (1) Transfer Station: Stanley Billig, via phone call on 01/08/10, stated that he will not be returning to the transfer station. (Stanley Billig added that he has recovered well from his double knee replacement but is still receiving therapy). Kevin Deppe informed the BOS that he has prepared a schedule for the transfer station for the first ¼ of 2010, using the 2 current part time employees as directed. Dave Najarian suggested that the township consider using a 3rd person as a back up or alternate. Kermit DeLong stated that the township did not discredit Stanley Billig's past performance as a township employee. Kermit DeLong also added that the BOS owed an apology, to the two part time workers at the transfer station, for comments that were made at the previous meeting. The BOS agreed. The BOS also directed the road crew to fence off an area inside the Transfer Station for the acceptance of scrap metal, copper, steal etc... (2) The Sewer Planning Module issues, for Larry & Renee Bachman, came back "incomplete" with more comments. Bill Beitler's office ran an advertisement and the 30 day advertising is in process will be up on 2/7/2010. Kevin Deppe stated that he has spoken with Carl Wolfe and he has stated that plans in other townships are getting kicked back also. (3) Kevin Deppe also reported that he has spoken with state representative Gary Day concerning the right-to-know request for the name of the individual who reported Ontelaunee Park for ground disturbance in a flood plain.

Resolution 2010-09: A motion was by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to adopt RESOLUTION 2010-09; A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LYNN ESTABLISHING A FEE SCHEDULE FOR ENGINEERING OR MUNICIPAL CONSULTANT FEES FOR SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT REVIEW. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION 2010-10: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to adopt RESOLUTION 2010-10; A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP LEHIGH COUNTY. PA ADOPTING PROPOSED REVISIONS TO THE HEIDELBERG/LYNN EARNED INCOME TAX REGULATIONS. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution 2010-11: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich seconded by David C. Najarian to adopt RESOLUTION 2010-11; A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LYNN, LEHIGH COUNTY APPOINTING ZONING HEARING BOARD MEMBERS. Kermit E. DeLong opposed the motion. Motion carried. The resolution appoints Bryan Rassler as an alternate member on the ZHB until 01/01/2012.

Miscellaneous: (1) Discussion was held concerning incidents and safety on Holbens Valley Road. Kevin Deppe stated that he has a meeting with PennDOT on Tuesday, January 19, 2010 @ 2pm to discuss these traffic issues and will report back to the BOS at the next meeting on February 11th. (2) Conflict Council. Marc Fisher has recommended Jack Stoeger as conflict council for Lynn Township. Marc Fisher will notify Mr. Stoeger and have him forward his proposal. (3) Salt shed. Kermit DeLong suggested that the board consider putting money aside for a new salt shed. Brian Dietrich suggested looking into pre-cast walls. Prevailing wages would come into affect at 25K. (4) Kermit DeLong asked the board if an AARC would be possible if a traffic study would be put into action. Dave Najarian stated that he was not opposed to the issue if all the planning tools and zoning issues were put into place. (5) PC Meetings. Brian Dietrich suggested that a member of the board attend the PC meetings on a regular basis or at least every quarter. Dave Najarian stated that between the current board members, attendance at the PC meetings has been regular. Brian Dietrich suggested doing a schedule with the board members to rotate attendance at the PC meetings. (6) COG Representative. A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to appoint Kevin Deppe as Representative to the COG and Kermit E. DeLong as alternate. Motion carried unanimously.
