Board of Supervisors Friday, February 19th, 2010 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.-7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

<u>Call to Order</u>: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors, rescheduled from February 11, 2010, was called to order by Chairman David C. Najarian, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman David C. Najarian, Vice Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Member Kermit E. DeLong Jr., Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Solicitor Marc Fisher, NW Press Reporter Ken Petrini, and approximately 11 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Executive Session: Chairman, Dave Najarian announced that an executive session was held on Wednesday, February 3, 2010 @ 9:00 AM to discuss an employment issue.

Public Comment: (1) Resident, Richard Snyder stated that in 1990 he suggested an environmental impact study be done on traffic and nothing has been done yet even though there have been a lot of issues and planning brought before the board. Dave Najarian stated that in December of 2009 there was a consensus with the board to form a committee. (2) Resident, Rob Sadler congratulated the previous BOS that in a difficult economic time the township showed a surplus for last year. Mr. Sadler stated that it shows a lot of effort and observation on the part of the board and staff. Mr. Sadler noted that there will still be hard times and 2009 will be tough to duplicate. Tammy M. White informed Mr. Sadler that the 50K donation for the rescue truck was taken out in 2009. Mr. Sadler added that his opinion is that any excess funds not needed by the township should be returned to the tax payers. (3) Resident, Greg Snyder stated his opinion on the rezoning of the GC/GI to allow mixed used. There was a short discussion between the BOS and Mr. Snyder regarding changes to the GC/GI zoning district to allow for mixed uses in that district.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to accept the minutes from 01/14/10. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to direct the treasurer to pay the bills. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote. Motion carried. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company.

Subdivision- (1) Brandon Junge driveway waivers, lot line adjustment plan: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong granting both the driveway waiver and lot line adjustment. Motion carried unanimously. A second motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich conditionally granting the waivers based upon any and all outstanding fees and escrow accounts being paid in full and that the lot line discussed is labeled "Rear" lot line on the plan and that a note is placed on the plan concerning the waiver of the 2002-01 Driveway Ordinance section 4, #10 and #11. Motion carried unanimously. (2) NW Self Storage extension: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to grant an extension thru September 30, 2011 contingent upon any outstanding fees & costs. Motion carried unanimously.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Roadmaster, reported for the month of <u>January</u>: (1) Tree trimmed 3 roads. (2) Boom mowed. (3) Filled pot holes on dirt roads. (4) Built cage for scrap metal at the Transfer Station. (5) Installed new signs and made repairs to others. (6) Repairs made to plow hitches and salt spreaders and boom mower. (7) Plowed, salted & cindered roads. Anticipated work for <u>February</u>: (1) Continue boom mowing. (2) Tree Trimming. The BOS commended the Road Crew for a great job of maintaining the roads during the snow storm on February 10, 2010. The BOS also stated that the township is not responsible for any mailboxes that were damaged during the storm due to the fact that the majority of mailboxes are in the townships right a way.

Managers Report: Kevin Deppe, Township Manager, reported for the month of January: (1) A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to budget the EAC \$500. Motion carried unanimously. (2) A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to retain Greg Snyder to further check the piping in the kitchen facility in the park with hopes to try and solve the water testing issue. (3) A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing Marc Fisher to prepare a lease for the Historical Society. Motion carried unanimously. Bill Beitler has offered to survey the section of land for the Historical Society at no cost. (4) A quote pf 18K was received for the band shell railings. Kevin Deppe will obtain a quote from Wallace, who originally did the construction of the railings. (5) Historical Society President, Willard Snyder will be contacted to ask if the Historical Society would possible be interested in the old grader that currently is located in the park. There were suggestion to donate it to the Historical Society or possible sell it. (6) The BOS held discussion on a plan to house the park maintenance equipment in the park. The equipment is currently housed at the Sewer Authority. It was discussed that the lower part of the old pavilion could be closed in. Roadmaster, Bruce Raber stated that the road crew would be able to do the enclosure. Kevin Deppe will check into the legality of such a project. (7) The BOS directed Kevin Deppe to put a list together of ordinances such as the Junk car / Junk Yard / Nuisance, for revamping. (8) Kevin Deppe received a quote for the conference room to upgrade the meeting table. Dave Najarian was not prepared to make a decision. (9) Upon DEP's response to the 30 day public notice period which ended on 02/13/10 for the sewage planning module for Larry Bachman,

Kevin Deppe has filed a new planning module with DEP. (10) DEP has responded to the R2K request submitted by state representative Gary Day, concerning the report of wet land coverage in Ontelaunee Park. DEP has asked for another 30 day due to under staffing. This brings the deadline to March 5, 2010. Kevin Deppe will check with Gary Day upon the deadline. (11) Kevin Deppe announced that 116 letters have been sent to residents of Madison Park North. The letters were sent on behalf of the snow storm on February 10, 2010. Kevin Deppe noted in the letter, ordinance 96-5. (12) Kevin Deppe informed the BOS that due to the storm, gutters and downspouts have been torn from the main office building. Kevin Deppe will check with the insurance company concerning deductibles. (13) SMP for the entire township will be discussed at a future meeting.

Ag Security: Alice J. P. Bastian 7566 Zeisloff Rd 3 parcels: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by David C. Najarian to accept the <u>Proposal-</u> Alice J. P. Bastian 7566 Zeisloff Rd (3 parcels) - 7566 Zeisloff RD. NT - into the Agricultural Security Area. Motion carried unanimously. This will be passed by resolution 180 days from the time the motion to accept the parcel into the Ag Security. Resolution will be prepared for the 08/12/10 BOS meeting.

RESOLUTION 2010-12: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to adopt RESOLUTION 2010-12; A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH COUNTY, PA FOR THE TRANSFER OF UNENCOMBERED MONEYS FROM ONE TOWNSHIP ACCOUNT TO ANOTHER. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Declaration of Disaster:</u> A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich that the storm that hit on Wednesday, February 10, 2010 was declared a disaster. Motion carried unanimously. Dave Najarian added that when a declaration of disaster emergency is declared the township may be eligible for a state reimbursement.

Regional Planning Meeting: Kevin Deppe will confer with the other townships for a possible date for a meeting.

<u>Conflict Council</u>: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to appoint John O. Stover, Jr. as Lynn Township's Conflict Council at the rate stated in Mr. Stover's resume letter. Motion carried unanimously.

2009 Audit: The BOS stated that a "Close out Audit Mtg." should be advertised in The Morning Call edition on 02/23/10 with the meeting being held on Wednesday, February 24, 2010 @ 10 AM. Audit Chairman, Robert Hamm thanked the office staff for all of their help.

Review of Ordinances: Discussed under Managers report.

Park Directors Position: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to dissolve the title "Park Director". Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by David C. Najarian to set the part time road crew rate, for Richard Matthias to \$15.00/hr.

Miscellaneous: None Public Comment: None
