Board of Supervisors Thursday, May 12th, 2011 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.-7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

<u>Call to Order</u>: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Vice Chairman Kermit E. DeLong, Member David C. Najarian, Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Solicitor Marc Fisher, NW Press Reporter Elsa Kerschner, and approximately 21 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Susan Schawl, from the CCL Food Pantry, was present and asked the BOS if they would reconsider giving a donation toward the 80K addition to the Food Pantry. The BOS stood on their decision of the April meeting, that tax payer's money should not be used for governmental issues.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to accept the minutes from 04/14/11 to direct the treasurer to pay all the bills except for the Horwith bill. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to direct the treasurer to pay the Horwith bill. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company. Motion carried.

<u>Subdivisions</u>: Terry & Jacqueline Kemmerer planning modules (2 lots): A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong approving the planning modules. Motion carried unanimously.

SA/BOS Joint meeting: A joint meeting was held between the BOS and SA members on Friday, May 6, 2011 to discuss the sewer authority take over of LCA. Lengthy discussion was held with a motion being made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing Solicitor Marc Fisher to prepare the necessary document (a resolution requested by SA member Steve Feinour and Willard Wanamaker) in consultation with Attorney William Schantz so as to set a time span and incorporate a mutual agreeable time from 120 days to transfer the SA to township assets and to include an agreement with LCA. Motion carried unanimously.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Roadmaster, reported for the month of April: (1) Pot hole patching on black top roads. (2) Pot hole patching on dirt roads. (3) Hauled 2RC from Slatedale to use on dirt roads. (4) Cleaned out gutters and filled in and graded dirt roads. (5) Took off all salt spreaders on trucks and made some repairs to salt spreaders and also put spill plates on trucks. (6) Repaired a stop sign and replaced 2 road name signs. (7) Replaced batteries on grader and cleaned out and painted battery boxes. (8) Made repairs to 91 Chevy snow plow hitch. (9) Swept roads where needed. (10) Made a new grate for storm box at park. (11) Changed oil and filter on some trucks and equipment. (12) Hauled all remaining wood chips from the recycling center to the shop. (13) Hauled away a load of scrap from recycling center totaling \$184.00. (14) Filled pot holes in Park. Anticipated work for May: (1) Continue working on dirt roads. (2) Possibly start shoulder paving. (3) Possibly start shoulder mowing.

A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to award Lynn Township's portion of the joint oil bid to Dosch King Emulsions Inc. for 35,000 gallons @ \$2.04/gallon for a total cost of \$71,400.00. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Pension:</u> A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian Dietrich authorizing Duane Peoples to move forward with the following recommendation: 1. Advise The Standard that we will do a hard freeze; 2. Check what the exit fees would be from The Standard to the new custodian; 3. Liquidate funds out of the defined benefit plan; 4. Move custodial funds from The Standard to American Funds; 5. Appoint Don Boetger & Associates as the 3rd party administrator; 6. Enrollment documents to be filled out; 7. Select funds; 8. Meet with employees. Motion carried unanimously.

Managers Report: Kevin Deppe, Township Manager, reported: (1) GCGI: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong that the GCGI draft ordinance be submitted to both the LVPC and Lynn Township PC for their review and set a date of next available BOS meeting. Motion carried unanimously. (2) Bank Funds: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing the Township Manager and Treasurer to proceed with the Capital Reserve funds to invest the funds in lattered CD's of mixed maturities at The New Tripoli Bank. Motion carried unanimously. (3) Bank Barn: The inspection agency has stated that the Bank Barn requires signed sealed plans in or order to be erected in the park. The BOS directed that Kevin Deppe along with Willard Snyder have a conference call with L & I. (4) Nestle Water: Kevin Deppe reported that Nestlé's water report has been received by the township. (5) Multi purpose field: Kevin Deppe stated that Richard Snyder prepared the multi purpose field with a rock hound and the field is ready for seed. The BOS thanked Richard Snyder for his work.

<u>Miscellaneous:</u> (1) Kermit DeLong stated that he feels the township needs to look into a zero turn lawnmower for the park. Kevin Deppe will look into it. (2) Kevin Deppe also reported that he has received more complaints about the amusement business on Donats Peak Road and that the issue has escalated. (3) Bruce Raber reported that Hamm Ct. is taking a big hit with the construction of Leaser Lake. Bruce Raber will speak with the company working on the Lake to see if they would be willing to help with repairs once the construction project is done.

<u>Public Comment</u>: (1) Eric Schellhamer stated that he had a previous conversation with Kevin Deppe concerning the ability to get funds from people by shutting off their water. Kevin Deppe stated that if the water is shut off the SA should contact him as BCO because people cannot live in a home where the water has been shut off. It is a health & safety issue. The BOS suggested that this be part of the agreement with LCA. (2) There was an inquiry to rent the park on Sunday, July 31st for a Benefit Concert. Janet Henritzy has informed them that they need to come before the BOS for approval of the event.

Announcements: (1) 4th Annual Ontelaunee Park Powwow; May 13-14-15 Gates open @ 10am \$7.00 admission; \$5.00 seniors; children under 12 free. (2) 3rd Annual Car & Motorcycle Show; Sunday, July 17, 2011; 2pm till 6pm Ontelaunee Park. \$7 entrance fee for all cars, trucks and biked; free admission for spectators.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by David C. Najarian to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:15 pm.
