<u>Call to Order</u>: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Vice Chairman Kermit E. DeLong, Member David C. Najarian, Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Solicitor Marc Fisher, NW Press Reporter Elsa Kerschner, and approximately 11 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Kermit DeLong stated that he is tired of hearing comments and constant conflict concerning Township Manager Kevin Deppe especially recently with issues concerning the Bank Barn. Kermit DeLong stated that the board, along with the township, needs to let Kevin Deppe do his job.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to accept the minutes from 06/09/11 and to direct the treasurer to pay all the bills except for the Horwith bill. Motion carried. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to direct the treasurer to pay the Horwith bill. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company. Motion carried.

<u>Subdivisions</u>: <u>Terry & Jacqueline Kemmerer Preliminary</u>: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich granting final approval for the Kemmerer subdivision contingent upon all escrow fees being paid. Motion carried unanimously.

Road Report: Road Master Bruce Raber reported for the month of <u>June</u>: (1) Finish shoulder mowing. (2) Cleaned & swept roads to be oil & chip. (3) Helped Lowhill Twp. with their shoulder paving. (4) Helped Weisenberg Twp. with their oil & chip. (5) Heidelberg, Lowhill, and Weisenberg helped Lynn Twp. with their oil & chip. (6) Helped Lowhill oil & chip. (7) Helped Heidelberg oil & chip. (8) Paved 2 handicap parking area's in the park. Anticipated work for <u>July:</u> (1) Work on dirt roads. (2) Start second round of shoulder mowing.

Najarian approving Resolution 2011-16: A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH COUNTY, PA AUTHORIZING, EMPOWERING AND DIRECTING THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE LYNN TOWNSHIP TO APPOINT A LIASON, SECRETARY/TREASURER AND ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY, BETWEEN AND AMONG LYNN TOWNSHIP, THE LEHIGH TAX COLLECTION COMMITTEE AND BERKHEIMER, THE DULY APPOINTED TAX OFFICER FOR THE COLLECTION OF EARNED INCOME TAX, FOR THE EXPRESS PURPOSE OF SHARING CONFIDENTIAL TAX INFORMATION FOR OFFICIAL PURPOSES OR AS PROVIDED BY LAW.. Resolution 2011-17: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by David C. Najarian approving Resolution 2011-17: A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH COUNTY, PA FOR THE TRANSFER OF UNENCOMBERED MONEYS FROM ONE TOWNSHIP ACCOUNT TO ANOTHER. Motion carried unanimously.

Managers Report: Kevin Deppe, Township Manager, reported: (1) Multi Purpose field: Kevin reported that they are

trying to keep up with watering the new multi purpose field in the Park.

Miscellaneous: (1) LCA take over of Sewer Authority: Marc Fisher reported that the BOS will be receiving the 1st draft agreement of LCA and Lynn Township for the boards review. The adopted resolution 2011-14 contains 2 provisions, those being: a) That a formal agreement with LCA was to be completed by August 15, 2011. This timeline no longer seems feasible. The BOS agreed to extend the deadline. b) That the sewer authority provides a list of their debts and assets by September 30, 2011. The BOS directed that a letter from the township be sent to the Sewer Authority requesting that they provide the information as soon as possible. Hornstein has sent the Sewer Authority a letter requesting that their tapping fees, totaling 96K, be returned. (2) Brian Dietrich and Dave Najarian stated that they would be unable to attend the EIT meeting on Monday, July 18, 2011. Kermit DeLong will be able to attend, but asked that we check with Carol Betz to see if she can reschedule the meeting. (3) An executive session was called at 7:30 pm to discuss personnel issues regarding the vacant position at the REC Fields. The regular meeting resumed at 7:35 pm.

Public Comment: (1) Bruce Raber thanked Kevin Deppe and Roy Stewart for obtaining the proper permits to proceed with receiving shale from the Leaser Lake Dam project to be used on township roads. (2) Vice Chairman of the REC Advisory Committee, Ben Giralico reported that the summer music program has been great. The committee received a 5K grant for Music in the Park. Ben Giralico also stated that the committee is looking for new members. (3) Secretary of the REC Advisory Committee, Sue Giralico reported on the 3rd annual Car Cruise and that they could use volunteers to
