Board of Supervisors Thursday, August 8th, 2013 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.~7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

<u>Call to Order</u>: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Justin N. Smith, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Justin N. Smith, Vice Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Member Kermit E. DeLong, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Asst. Secretary/Treasurer Janet L. Henritzy, Engineer Roy Stewart, Solicitor Marc Fisher, NW Press Reporter Elsa Kerschner, and approximately 20 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Public Comment: (1) Resident, David Najarian spoke out about two issues, the first being the safety of the fireman during a "Fireman's Competition Night" and the possibility of them not being covered under workers compensation in the event of an accident or injury. Tammy M. White will check with Workman's Comp to see if the Fireman would be covered for this event. The second concern of Mr. Najarian had was concerning a copy of a document provided in a controversial email prior to the Primary election held on May 21, 2013, that referenced a list of preserved farms with hand writing in the margins by former Township Manager Kevin Deppe with depiction of 4 individuals who were: Dave Najarian, Brian Dietrich, Ronald Hartman, and Carson Bear. Dave Najarian asked supervisor Justin N. Smith if Kevin Deppe was targeting these certain people and if Justin Smith directed Kevin Deppe to give this information to him. Justin Smith stated that Kevin Deppe was gone before the election. Dave Najarian stated that Justin Smith, in a flyer he used when he was running for Supervisor, was for farm land preservation. Dave Najarian stated that he felt that Justin Smith obviously was not for farm land preservation and asked Justin Smith if he was lying about his statement that he was for farm land preservation. Justin N. Smith stated that he was not going to answer this question in this form. Kermit DeLong added that Kevin Deppe did not single out anyone. Resident, Ben Giralico asked the BOS where they stand on farm land preservation. Kermit DeLong stated that there needs to be a balance.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to accept the minutes from 07/11/13 and direct the treasurer to pay the bills. Motion carried unanimously.

Fire Companies: No report.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Road master, reported for the month of <u>July</u>: (1) Worked on some dirt roads that washed out from heavy rains. (2) Hauled scrap metal from recycling center \$123.20. (3) Helped Heidelberg. Lowhill townships finish their oil & chipping. (4) Swept the roads that were oil & chipped. (5) Started the 2nd round of shoulder mowing. (6) Made 4 speed bumps in the park. (7) Removed large stumps in park and filled in with shale. (8) Cut up a few trees that up rooted and fell on roads. (9) Got the parking lot in the front of the park ready for oil & chip. (10) Double yellow line's have been painted on roads. Anticipated work for <u>August:</u> (1) Oil & chip parking lot in Park. (2) Work on dirt roads. (3) Fill in some small wash outs. (4) Continue shoulder mowing. Roy Stewart stated that PennDot will fix and replace the sinkhole at Behler and Rt. 143. After the issue is fixed then the Township will be responsible for the maintenance.

Joint Resolution: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong approving Resolution 2013-20; A RESOLUTION OF LYNN, HEIDELBERG, LOWHILL, AND WEISENBERG TOWNSHIPS CRAETING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR THE OWNERSHIP AND OPERATION OF A STEEL DRUM ROLLER & TRAILER. Motion carried unanimously. Resident, Dave Najarian stated that such a transaction must be done by Ordinance. Solicitor, Marc Fisher stated that was correct and that the resolution was an intergovernmental cooperation agreement.

<u>Codification:</u> Solicitor, Marc Fisher and Engineer, Roy Stewart have completed the project and have submitted the proposed amendments. The Lynn Township/Proposed Amendments to the Lynn Township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance and Proposed Amendments to the Lynn Township Zoning Ordinance need to be sent to the Lehigh Valley Planning Commission and to the Lynn Township Planning Commission for their review and then a public hearing will be scheduled for October 10th 2013. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to send the Lynn Township/Proposed Amendments to the Lynn Township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance and Proposed Amendments to the Lynn Township Zoning Ordinance to the Lehigh Valley Planning Commission and to the Lynn Township Planning Commission for their review. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Duane Peoples:</u> Pension update: Mr. Peoples presented the BOS with the pension update. The BOS stated they need time to review the info and will discuss the matter at the next BOS meeting in September. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to pass <u>Resolution 2013-21</u>: A RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER FUNDS IN THE 457(B) PLAN TO THE 401(A) PLAN. Motion carried unanimously.

Ag Security Proposal: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong approving receipt of the Ag Security request by Elton & Seleda Weaver and to include the Pin # 541923434337 and for the staff to process the Ag Security request. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Miscellaneous:</u> (1) <u>Janet Henritzy</u> reported that the small foot bridge in Ontelaunee Park has been repaired – the kitchen facilities are underway – The Rotary Club will pick up the expense of staining the band shell and Janet will get in contact with Reppert Painting, Jocelyn Reppert to set up a date for them to proceed with the project. (2) Kermit DeLong stated that there has been a lot of pressure on the office staff since Kevin Deppe is gone and suggested that the

supervisors take on more to get a firm handle on everything. (3) Kermit DeLong asked who is responsible for the maintenance or possible replacement of a memorial that is given to Ontelaunee Park. Solicitor, Marc Fisher stated that he will check into it. (4) Justin Smith asked where we were at with the transfer station recycling and magnetic markers for the bins. Tammy M. White reported that she met with Berger to review their recycling fees and Berger stated they didn't think they could come in less expensive the Cougles. Tammy M. White will contact Cougles regarding the magnetic signs. (5) Engineer, Roy Stewart stated he was following up on a pool complaint. (6) Janet Henritzy reported that she has left a message for David Wright regarding the water/Electrical issue in Ontelaunee Park. Brian C. Dietrich stated that he would try to get in contact with David Wright. Janet Henritzy did report that she did find old permits in regards to the electricity. Janet Henritzy has also been trying to contact Met-Ed regarding the electricity at the Transfer Station.

<u>Public Comment</u>: (1) Resident, Sean Scanlon of Falcon Court addressed the BOS for an update on Falcon Ct. Solicitor, Marc Fisher stated that PennDot did agree to dig out on the other side of Falcon. Marc Fisher stated that he has not heard back from Pergosky and added that in order for the township to accept Falcon an offer has to be made by Pergoskys and the offer has not been made yet. Justin N. Smith stated that he will try and get in contact with Pergosky.

Announcements: (1) Night in the Country is scheduled for Saturday, August 17, 2013 with a rain date of Sunday, August 18, 2013. (2) Sunday, August 11, 2013 from 5pm till 8pm the Todd Wolfe Band in Ontelaunee Park.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:26 pm.
