Board of Supervisors Thursday, November 3rd, 2011 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.~7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

Call to Order: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Vice Chairman Kermit E. DeLong Jr., Member David C. Najarian., Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Roadmaster Bruce Raber, Solicitor Marc Fisher, and approximately 2 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Public Comment: (1) Resident, Russell Wambold stated that snow had been plowed up against their house, located on Hoffadeckel Ct., and later was moved. Roadmaster, Bruce Raber stated that there was a new employee plowing and that that the new employee has been made aware of the situation for future reference. In addition, Mr. Wambold stated that there is a residence on Hoffadeckel Ct. that continues to park on the road and also are accumulating garbage and junk which is making the place look a mess. Bruce Raber stated that the vehicles are parked more on the shoulder of the road. Kevin Deppe stated that if action is taken on this individual, he will then need to pursue at least an additional 14 properties within the township that are not in compliance with the township ordinance and that he would need the backing of the BOS on all accounts. Dave Najarian agreed.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to accept the minutes from 10/13/11 and direct the treasurer to pay all the bills except for the Horwith fuel bill. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing payment of the Horwith fuel bill. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote due to the payment of the Horwith Fuel Oil bill. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company. Motion carried.

<u>Subdivision-</u> #11-05 Susan Schall Subdivision; planning module: Kevin Deppe stated that they are still working with LMOA to take it out of a flood plain. <u>John Scully Waiver</u>: Mr. Scully has retracted his request for the waiver.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Roadmaster, reported for the month of October: (1) Changed oil and filters in trucks and equipment. (2) Finished up dirt roads. (3) Worked on Hamm Ct., by filling in with 2 RC. These roads along with Slateville, Utt and Follweiler have all been affected by the repairs being done at Leaser Lake. Bruce Raber met with the gentlemen from the Leaser lake dam project to discuss repairs to these roads upon completion of the dam project. They stated to Mr. Raber that they are responsible to repair the roads back to the condition the roads were in before the project was started. (4) Helped Heidelberg Twp. and Weisenberg Twp. with paving. (5) Did some boom mowing. (6) Opened pipes and drains. (7) Put salt spreaders on trucks, and plowed snow. (8) Did a lot of tree removal on township roads. Anticipated work for November: (1) Tree Trimming. (2) Possibly crack seal roads.

Tax Rate for Year 2012: Tabled (see budget discussion)

Joint Salt Bid: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to award the joint salt bid to Cargill Deicing for 200 Ton of sodium chloride deicing rock salt @ \$58.69/ton Unit Price Delivered, for a total cost of \$11,738.00. Motion carried unanimously. Washington Township did the joint bidding. The results were as follows:

Budget: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing the advertisement of the 2012 Budget and to include any amendments that may be reflected in the 2012 Budget. Motion carried unanimously. Items that may reflect the budget are: Interest from the CD's; Wage increase for the current P/T park workers to \$10/hr as well as the addition of 2 additional P/T workers at the rate of \$8.50/hr for approximately 2 months in spring and 2 months in fall equaling 16 weeks. The monthly and year to date reports were discussed by the board. The year to date reports (Jan. thru Oct. 2011) reflect the township to be in the black \$119K; approximately 45K of the monies is LFF money that still remains in the LFF account in anticipation of Bruce Raber adding this amount to the 2012 disbursement to do some overlays that are needed. By deducting this amount of 45K, it puts us approximately 10K in the black more at this time this year as compared to last year. The township ended the 2010 year in the black approximately 65K and as it stands for 2011 will end the year approximately 75K in the black.

<u>Conveyance Agreement:</u> Solicitor, Marc Fisher stated that a meeting was held involving all parties and that the meeting was very successful. The SA needs to supply LCA with the identification of easements. Mr. Fisher stated that the agreement should be before the BOS at the December 8th meeting for approval and the agreement will go to LCA on December 12th for their approval and that the transition should be totally completed on or be February 29, 2012.

<u>Executive Session</u>: Solicitor Marc Fisher called an executive session at 8:00 pm which included all BOS members along with Kevin Deppe. The regular BOS meeting resumed at 8:05pm.

Managers Report: Kevin Deppe, Township Manager, reported UPDATES: (1) Mowing in Ontelaunee Park: Kevin Deppe, at the last BOS meeting, was directed to look into the current outside vendor, who has been cutting grass in the park, to see what his cost would be to maintain the grass cutting in Ontelaunee Park for the 2012 season. The cost came in at \$550.00/wkly or \$15,400 for the season which was considerably lower that the other quotes received. A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing Kevin Deppe to move forward with the purchase of a zero turn mower via costars or state contract and not to exceed \$17, 500. Motion carried unanimously. Also the two current PT employees that maintain the Park will be capped at \$10/hr. In addition 2 more PT employees will be brought in at the rate of \$8.50/hr to help in the park for 2 months in spring till the college students returns and for 2 months in fall when the college student returns to college which totals 16 weeks. Each additional employee will be used as needed. (2) Upgrade of phone system: Lengthy discussion was held on the upgrade of the phone system. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing Kevin to move forward with the new phone system at a cost just under 4K. Motion carried unanimously. (3) Computer upgrade: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing the upgrade of computers and server as well as an adequate transition, through LTS's quote from 10/25/2011 subject to an adequate backup system. Motion carried unanimously. Dave Najarian stated that he would like to speak with Mike Hofke from LTS concerning the backup system. (4) Subdivisions: There are 3 new subdivisions that have come in and at least 2 of them will require the lots to have individual on lot maintenance agreements recorded with the approved plans and when the lots are sold an agreement signed by the new owner. These are similar to the 2 previous on lot agreements except that DEP has some new language they would like to see in the agreement. The BOS agreed to have Marc Fisher address these subdivision so they do not get delayed in the process. Marc Fisher agreed to do so. (5) Security fence: The BOS agreed for Kevin Deppe to move ahead with having the chain link fence installed at the new maintenance building at the cost of \$2,890.00 for installation. (6) Tree & Brush Debris: Previously there has been discussion of 4 separate options of removal of tree and brush debris at the transfer station. The BOS unanimously agreed that the transfer station will no longer accept tree and brush debris.

Miscellaneous: (1) Heidelberg/Lynn Historical Society request for key: Kermit DeLong brought up the issue of the Historical Societies request for a key to the Park pavilion. During the last BOS meeting held on October 13th, Brian Dietrich was in favor of issuing a key to Willard Snyder; President of the Heidelberg/Lynn Historical Society and Kermit DeLong was not in favor of issuing any keys not only to Willard Snyder but to anyone else other than the caretakers of the park. Dave Najarian was absent from the meeting but during this meeting held on November 3rd, Dave Najarian stated that he to was not in favor of issuing additional keys to any individual other than those individuals who already have keys as employees. Dave Najarian stated that since the park is closed for the year, the issue could be revisited next year when a new board member will be on the board.

Announcements: Trick or Treat has been rescheduled for Saturday, November 5, 2011 from 6pm to 8pm.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by David C. Najarian to adjourn the meeting.

Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:10 pm.
