Board of Supervisors Tuesday, December 27th, 2011 (Close-out meeting) @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.-7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

<u>Call to Order</u>: The Close-out meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Brian C. Dietrich at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Vice Chairman Kermit E. DeLong Jr., member David C. Najarian, Solicitor Marc Fisher, Zoning Officer Kevin N. Deppe, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, NW Press reporter Elsa Kerschner, and approximately 50+ citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Public Comment: 1. Sludge dumping: Dave Najarian opened this topic of discussion by stating that the state (Cin-agrow) is forcing the sludge dumping in townships and the township has no authority. Dave Najarian along with the board stated that all those involved need to speak to their representative Gary Day in regards to the execution of bio solids. Dave Najarian also added that Lynn Township has previously tried to challenge the issue of sludge dumping only to be challenged by the Attorney General that the township will be sued successfully upon the township trying to execute a resolution to ban sludge dumping. Dave Najarian added with documentation that other townships have been sued in the process. Again the board stated to all those involved that they need to take the issue to the state level. Kermit DeLong stated that he will invite Gary Day to the January 12, 2012 BOS meeting and invites the public to attend. Justin Smith, as a resident, read 2 paragraphs from a notice from DEP which stated that they are promoting a good thing with sludge dumping along with the benefits and that EPA is promoting this. Justin Smith along with the rest of the board does not agree. Note: Numerous residents spoke concerning their issues with e-coli and well contamination as well debris on the roads. The residents that spoke with their concerns all reside in Broadtail Ct.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong to accept the minutes from 12/08/11 and direct the treasurer to pay the bills except for the Horwith fuel bill. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich to pay the Horwith Fuel Bill. David C. Najarian abstained from the vote due to the payment of the Horwith Fuel Oil bill. Dave Najarian prepared a Conflict of Interest Memorandum of Abstention in January 2008 because he recused himself in the event a bill would need to be paid to the Lynnport Fire Company. Motion carried.

Subdivision: Ronald Utt Final: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong for final on the Ronald Utt Subdivision. Motion carried unanimously. Miller Rd Farms #5 Final: A motion was made David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong approving the sewage module subject to the execution to DEP. Motion carried unanimously. Marc Fisher has prepared a declaration of conveyance and will forward it to Kevin Deppe. John Scully letter of credit: A motion was made by David C. Najarain and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing the letter of credit from \$46,073.00 down to the remaining balance of \$11,608.14. Motion carried unanimously. Susan Schall sewer planning module: Tabled from previous meeting.

Appointment of outside audit firm: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong approving Resolution 2011-21; A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP LEHIGH COUNTY, APPOINTING A CERTIFIED (CPA) OR COMPETENT PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT OR FIRM OF SAME TO EXAMINE THE RECORDS OF THE TOWNSHIP, with a reference check to be done on the appointed firm of Frey & Co. and for the board to decide at a later date on the audit of the township tax collector. Motion carried unanimously. Frey & Co. has been named in Resolution 2011-21. The Tax Collector's year runs from July 1st to June 30th.

Resolution 2011-22: A motion was made by Kermit E. DeLong and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing Resolution 2011-22; A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH COUNTY, PA ADOPTING WRITTEN PROCEDURES ON HOW PROFESSIONAL SERVICES ARE CHOSEN FOR ITS PENSION PLANS IN ORDER TO COMPLY WITH ACT 44 OF 2009 AND THE AUDITOR GENERAL'S RECOMMENDATION. Motion carried unanimously.

The Sanctuary at Haafsville: A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing payment of the 2011 invoice from The Sanctuary at Haafsville, in the amount of \$500. Motion carried unanimously. A second motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong not to accept the presented 2012 contract submitted by The Sanctuary at Haafsville. Motion carried unanimously.

Managers' Report: Park Mower: A mower for the park has been purchase and will be delivered in spring. The cost was held under the \$17,500 dollar amount. Phone System: The new phone system has been installed. An additional phone was installed in the meeting room for the BOS convenience. Computers: The new computers have been installed along with the new server. The total cost came in under the projected dollar amount. Fuel Bills: The NW Ambulance invoices are not being paid in timely manner. The BOS will decide how to proceed with the issue of fuel invoices to the Ambulance Corp. Security Fence: the security fence has been installed around the maintenance building in the park. This should provide for an extra measure against vandalism. The cost ran over by \$173.00 because some of the materials had to be purchased to complete the fence. Transfer Station Brush: Lots of inquiries have been made from residents on the acceptance of brush. The BOS stated that their decision remains the same and that no brush can be accepted at the transfer station. Establish Fees for Junk Yard Ordinance: The Township had enacted amendments to

the old junk yard and nuisance ordinance in 2011. Fees are required for the license and license renewal of any new scrap yards or junk yards providing the property meets the requirements of the ordinance. These fees need to be established by Resolution. The average fee is \$250.00 and must be renewed annually. Kevin Deppe asked the BOS to consider an amount which can be included in the Fee Schedule Resolution. HOP permit for Penn's View II: Renewal of the HOP for Penn's View II is going to expire and Penn Dot has stated that it must be modified to reflect the new drainage requirements. Kevin Deppe will confirm with Penn's View II as to their future development plans. Kevin Deppe stated that he has to sign off on the HOP and Penn dot may not want to sign off. 2011 Surplus: Kevin Deppe asked the BOS if the BOS would be in favor of using approximately 50K of 2011 surplus into a temporary (operating reserve fund). This fund would be available should the township run into a revenue shortfall in 2012. The 2nd class twp. Code allows for the supervisors to place these monies in an operating reserve fund no to exceed 5 percent of the estimated operating fund for current year. The BOS has expressed the desire to eventually eliminate the property tax long term and this would be sound fiscal move to try and achieve this goal. A motion was made by David C. Najarian and seconded by Kermit E. DeLong authorizing the Treasurer to open a new operating reserve account with 50K of the 2011 surplus from the General Fund. Motion carried unanimously.

Miscellaneous: 1. The Re-Org dinner date has been confirmed for Saturday, January 14, 2012 at 6pm at the LPFC. 2. Kermit DeLong thanked Dave Najarian for his years of services on the board and for the 4 years that he has served with him. 3. Brian Dietrich also thanked Dave Najarian for his years of service on the board and for the 2 years that he has served with him. 4. Kermit DeLong mentioned that his comment about being chairman in 2012 was only based upon a decision that had previously been discussed and initiated by Dave Najarian to have the 3 board members rotate the positions of chairman, vice chairman and member which gives each board member 2 years in each position. 5. Brian Dietrich suggested that each supervisor take charge of a certain department of the township. For example: Administration, Road Crew, and Park. Brian Dietrich stated that he has given this some thought and feels that this would possible save the township money because he suggested that the Township Manager's position could become a part time position. Further discussion will be held at the re-org.
