<u>Call to Order</u>: The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Justin N. Smith, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were Chairman Justin N. Smith, Vice Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Member Steve I. Feinour, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Admin/Zoning office Secretary Kathy A. Hermany, Road Master Bruce Raber, Engineer Chris Noll, Solicitor Marc Fisher, and approximately 9 citizens.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Media Representation: Kenny Bleiler, NWP.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Representative Intern, Wes Schlauch from Gary Day's office was present to thank the BOS and the Lynn Township Community for all their hard work. Mr. Schlauch also left brochures at the township as well as a US Flag and a PA Flag.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Steve I. Feinour to accept the minutes from 07/14/16 and direct the treasurer to pay the bills. Motion carried unanimously.

Subdivisions: Peter & Janet Kahora Preliminary Plan: Waiver: A motion was made by Steve I. Feinour and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich approving the waiver of section 316.4 and the deferral of section 316.3. Motion carried unanimously. A second motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Steve I. Feinour approving preliminary plan approval contingent upon meeting the requirements from KCE. Motion carried unanimously. Susan Schall Waiver: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Steve I. Feinour denying the waiver extension from Susan Schall. Motion carried unanimously. The BOS agreed that there is no reason to keep granting a waiver extension because it is in the feasibility stage and is currently a concept plan only.

Fire Companies: Fire Chief, Peter Christ reported the monthly report for New Tripoli Fire Company as did Clark Mantz from Lynnport Fire Company also gave his monthly report. Peter Christ reported that they will be attending Haz Mat Awareness classes as well as a Narcan class. A motion was made by Justin N. Smith and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing the fire police to assist at 08/26 Emmaus Wheels of Time Parade; 10/15 Emmaus Halloween Parade; NW football home games. Motion carried unanimously. A second motion was made by Justin N. Smith and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing the fire police to assist at the horse farm located on 863 for a fundraiser that they will be having. Motion carried unanimously. Fire Study: Both Fire Companies are working on the new computer system for the fire study and are making progress. The Fire Study committee meets again in September.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Road master, reported for the month of August: (1) Helped Heidelberg Twp. with their oil & chip. (2) Cold Patching. (3) Hauled scrap metal from recycling center = \$88.00. (4) Started on the second round of shoulder mowing. (5) Cut grass & weed wacked at recycling center. (6) Cleaned out everything & got floor ready for concrete in the new building enclosure. (7) Hauled about 600 Tons of millings up on the Blue Mt. House Rd. from Leaser Rd. to the top and started on the lower half. (8) All double yellow lines have been painted. (9) Helped Lowhill Twp. & Heidelberg Twp. with paving projects. (10) Cut up 6 large trees that fell on roads during heavy rain and wind. Anticipated work for August: (1) Continue shoulder mowing. (2) Continuing with cold patching. (3) Work on Dirt roads. (4) Cut some shoulders. Truck: A motion was made by Justin N. Smith and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing the purchase of a 2002 Single axle dump truck from Upper Macungie for 30K. Motion carried unanimously. The truck has 57K miles on it. A second motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Steve I. Feinour to use Liquid Fuel Money to purchase the truck. Motion carried unanimously. A third motion was made by Steve I. Feinour and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich authorizing the advertisement for bids of the 1991 Chevy dump truck Lynn Township currently owns. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Session: Justin N. Smith called an executive session at 6:56 pm to discuss personnel issues. The meeting resumed at 7:03 pm. Those in the executive session were Justin N. Smith, Brian C. Dietrich, Steve I. Feinour, and Bruce Raber.

Joint Salt Bids: A motion was made by Steve I. Feinour and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich. to award the joint salt bid to Cargill Deicing Technology, for a total of 250 Tons of sodium chloride deicing rock salt @ \$61.14/ton Unit Price Delivered, for a total cost of \$15,285.00 and \$59.00/ton Unit Price Pick Up, for a total cost of \$14,750.00. Motion carried unanimously. North Whitehall did the joint bidding and accepted all bids, awarded all bids, and accepted the lowest bid from Cargill Deicing Technology.
