Board of Supervisors Thursday, December 14th, 2023 @ 6:30 PM Lynn Twp.-7911 Kings Hgwy., New Tripoli

<u>Call to Order:</u> The regular meeting of the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Vice Chairman Steve I Feinour, at 6:30 pm in the Municipal Building. Present were, Chairman Justin N. Smith, Vice Chairman Brian C. Dietrich, Member Ronald Jerdon, Secretary/Treasurer Tammy M. White, Road Master Bruce Raber, Solicitor Marc Fisher, and approximately 9 citizens. Absent, Engineer Ryan Christman KCE, Admin./Secretary Trish Burkhardt.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

<u>Executive Session:</u> Justin N. Smith announced that the BOS held an executive session to discuss litigation. Those in the session where Justin N. Smith, Brian C. Dietrich, Ronald Jerdon, and Solicitor Marc Fisher.

Media Representation: Marieke Audronache.

Public Comment: 1. On Thursday November 11th the Lynn Township Board of Supervisors, along with The Lynn Township Vacancy Board, Vacancy Board Member Kermit E. DeLong and Lynn Township Board Chairman, Justin N. Smith where served complaint forms from the Office of the Sheriff Lehigh County PA. The forms where a notice of complaint that they have all been sued in court by Frederick K. Najarian. The suit was filed by Mr. Najarian stating that he felt that Kermit E. DeLong spoke with Chairman, Justin N. Smith prior to the vote of Ronald Jerdon to fill the vacant position of Steve I. Feinour. The Plaintiff, Frederick K. Najarian filed the law suit because he felt that the Sunshine Act was not followed. Notice, Dated 12/07/23 was received by Gross McGinley LLP stating that the law suit was discontinued and ended with prejudice. Frederick K. Najarian presented his withdrawal of the law suit during Public Comment, however still stated that he felt that the PA Sunshine Act was still violated.

Accept the Minutes and Direct the Treasurer to pay the bills: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon to accept the minutes from 11/09/23 and to direct the treasurer to pay the bills. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Subdivisions:</u> Nancy Smith-Final Donats Peak Rd..: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon granting final approval based on KCE conditions stated in letter dated 11/15/2023. Motion carried unanimously.

Ag Security proposal: Carson & Diane Kressley/Morgan Billig: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon accepting the proposal of Carson & Diane Kressley/Morgon Billig and directing the staff and solicitor to proceed with the paperwork. Motion carried unanimously.

Fire Companies: LPFC Asst. Fire Chief Tim VanBlargan reported: 62 calls for the year; Dec. 17th Santa Breakfast from 9am-1pm and after breakfast Santa will be driven around the LPFC district; a small handful of 2000 club tickets are still available. See any FF to get tickets; Christmas filling sale pickup is Dec. 20th from 4-6pm; Lynnport was awarded by DCNR for their 2023 50/50 matching grant. LPFC was awarded with just shy of 5K and according to the list LPFC was the only station in Lehigh County that was awarded funding from the 2023 grant. NTFC Fire Chief Gary Kuntz reported: 157 emergency calls to date; 1 FF is currently completing his VRT certification; 2 new members completed their Hax-Mat Awareness online certification and their NIMS 100,200,700; New Years Eve giveaway tickets are now on sale: A candlelight vigil was held on Thursday 12/7/23 for 2 fallen members; thanks everyone that attended the regional Christmas party on 12/9 featuring the Highway Run Band; completed our PA DOH State certification for our heavy rescue truck, this involved our members meeting certain certification levels, and our truck having the required equipment on it; In the process of renewing our PA State voluntary certification of our members; The paperwork was completed and submitted for the Lehigh County tax rebate of \$150 for active team members that responded to 20% of calls for 2023 and own property in Lynn Township; Annual Santa Run will be on Saturday 12/16. Santa will be at our station from 12-1 pm. The run will state at 1pm; This year's recruitment & retention program paid out \$16,520.88, we received \$7,674.00 from Lynn Township or 46%. Only members that responded to 20% of emergency calls were eligible; PA State certification paperwork for Supervisors to sign.

Road Report: Bruce Raber, Road master, reported for the month of November: (1) Boom mowing continues. (2) Cleaned out a few gutters & cut shoulders. (3) Put up 2 new toad signs on Brobst Hill Rd. (Narrow Road next 1 mile – 25 mph. (4) Filled pot holes on dirt roads. (5) Took down 2 large dead trees threatening to fall on road ways. (6) Cleaned & maintained outside fuel tank. (7) Spot salted a few roads. Anticipated work for <u>December:</u> (1) Continue boom mowing. (2) Fill pot holes on dirt roads. (3) Fill a few pot holes on black top roads (cold patch). <u>Township Certification for Employee's:</u> Justin N. Smith spoke with the NWL School District regarding CDL training of Township Employee's. The school has to options: 1. Costing 3K per person which comes with a "S" certificate which allows the driving of school bus, as well as the cost of a health physical. 2. Costing 2K per person with the minimum of having 2 individuals. This does not include the "S" certificate or the cost of a physical. Option 2 was proposed with a stipulation that if the employee leaves within 2 years, the cost would be taken from their final pay check. Justin N. Smith will contact the school to let them know and Marc Fisher will prepare any necessary paperwork for the employee to sign. A formal motion will be made at the next meeting. Note: These 2 options are opened to the Fire Companies as well.

<u>Park:</u> 3rd Annual Tree Lighting was a huge success. A special thank you to the Lehigh Chamber of Commerce, LPFC, NTFC and everyone who made the event a success. <u>Disc Golf Expansion</u>: Denny Barr from 3940 Pine Meadows Ln.

Allentown presented the BOS with installing 2 more baskets in the Park. Mr. Barr stated that the 2 have been donated and ready to go. A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon for Mr. Barr to move ahead with the installation of the 2 baskets and to come back with a proposal for what would be 8 more baskets to make the disc golf course an 18 basket course. Motion carried unanimously. John Bailey Park Tree: A motion was made by Justin N. Smith and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich for a tree to be planted in Ontelaunee Park in Honor of the 48 years that John Bailey served on the Lynn Township Planning Commission. Motion carried unanimously.

Forgotten Felines/PA Caring Hearts: A motion was made by Ronald Jerdon and seconded by Brian C. Dietrich approving the 2024 agreement(s) with PA Caring Hearts @ \$40 per cat and will hold dogs till the dog warden picks them up. A cap of 5K; and notice will be given when/if it reaches 4K and to include quarterly reports and Forgotten Felines and Fidos @ \$40 per cat includes rabies and distemper vaccine; \$25 extra for pregnant cats, with a cap of 5K; and notice will be given when/if it reaches 4K and to include quarterly reports. Motion carried unanimously.

2024 Budget: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon approving the 2024 Budget. Motion carried.

<u>Cable Franchise Resolution</u>: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon approving <u>Resolution 2023-20</u>: A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LYNN TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH COUNTY, PA APPROVING AMENDMENT NO.1 TO ITS CABLE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Resolution Reso.-2023-21</u>: A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon approving Resolution 2023-21; A RESOLUTION SETTING THE FEE FOR A TAX CERTIFICATION, DUPLICATE BILLS, RETURNED OR CANCELLED PAYMENTS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LYNN, LEHIGH COUNTY, PA. Motion carried. The resolution sets the Tax Certification at \$20, A Tax Duplicate at \$5 and the cancelled Check fee at \$50 and is effective January 1 2024.

EPD (Environmental Planning & Design): A motion was made by Brian C. Dietrich and seconded by Ronald Jerdon approving the advertisement of a joint Planning Commission and Board meeting on Tuesday, January 16-2024 at 7:00 pm to discuss/review with EPD regarding land/zoning uses in Lynn Township.

Zoning Officer: A motion will be made at the January 2, 2024 re-org meeting to appoint LTL Consultants, LTD as Lynn Townships new Zoning Officer.

<u>Miscellaneous:</u> (1) <u>Locks:</u> Brian C. Dietrich stated that it would be a good idea to change the locks on all township facilities and to reprogram the main office door. (2) <u>Facility Upgrades</u>: Ronald Jerdon stated that he has seen the working conditions of the road crew and feels that there needs to be some upgrades. (3) <u>Newsletter</u>: Ronald Jerdon also suggested that residents would benefit from a Township Newsletter. (4) <u>Live Streaming</u>: Brian C. Dietrich stated he would like if the meetings could be live streamed.

(5) <u>Appreciation/Re-Org Dinner</u>: The BOS had Tammy White check with Heather Utt @ LPFC to see what Friday nights are available.

<u>Public Comment</u>: (1) <u>Justin Smith</u>: Justin N. Smith thanked and spoke highly of all the township employee's including Marc Fisher, regarding his 12 years on the Board. Justin N. Smith added that diversity and different views are needed when serving on the Board of Supervisors. Justin N. Smith ended with it having been a privilege to serve the residents of Lynn Township and wished everyone well.
